# THE BLESSING OF THE WATERS

Beloved in the Lord,

Christ is Born! Glorify Him! Χριστός γεννάται! Δοξάσατε!

A blessed season of the Nativity! In this period of fasting, we abstain from richer foods in preparation for the Lord's Birth, and

then we feast in celebration of His Birth until Theophany Eve. The truth that we learn in this is that fasting and feasting go together. Feasting without fasting quickly becomes simple gluttony, but fasting without feasting falls quickly into an even more troubling error, the false idea that this Creation, and the good things that God has given to us, are in fact all tainted and sinful, and that matter itself is something to be despised. The Lord's Incarnation itself is proof against this idea, for He assumed physical matter, and took upon Himself our nature, and has made matter itself holy and glorious and beautiful, worthy of honor. It is this that we confess and celebrate when we feast on the great and holy days of the Church. We pray, then, that our preparatory fasting and our celebratory feasting may be blessed.

#### Sacramental Summary So Far

We have discussed the "Seven Sacraments" over these past several months; in all of these services, we encounter the Son of God Who became flesh and dwelt among us, our Lord Jesus Christ. He reveals the Father to us, and sends us the Holy Spirit. He is the One we encounter in humble glory within the cave in Bethlehem. He is the One Who comes to us in our brokenness, and raises us up to be with Him. Because Christ is in our midst, every action of the Church is sacramental, and every faithful Orthodox Christian is a living mystery & sacrament of His presence in this world.

As an extension of this, the Orthodox Church recognizes other Sacraments beyond the Seven. These include the Blessing of the Waters, the Services of Burial, the Consecration of a Church, the Tonsuring of a Monastic, and the Anointing of a Monarch. This month, we will consider the Blessing of the Waters, and how it reflects the extended reality of the Lord's Incarnation and presence with us, as this is simultaneously an appropriate reflection for this Christmas season, and a fitting preparation for the coming celebration of the Blessing of the Waters at Theophany on January 5th and 6th.

#### God is with Us

We remember, of course, that in St. Matthew's account of the Lord's birth, an angel comes to Joseph and assures him that the child being carried by the Theotokos is holy and will save His people from their sins. St. Matthew continues with a quote from the prophet Isaiah, that "a virgin will be with

Religious Education Initiative https://theruleoffaith.typepad.com/rei child and bear a Son, and they shall call His name Emmanuel, which is translated, 'God with us'" (Matthew 1:23). This reality is the unceasing confession, celebration, and comfort of the Church. We commune with the Lord every time we celebrate the Eucharist, and we encounter Him in all the Sacraments. In the Blessing of the Waters, we even bless and consecrate the physical matter of the world in which we live.

#### The Blessing of the Waters

This sacrament is a part of our celebration of the Lord's Baptism at Theophany on January 6th. There is a triple significance to this Feast. First of all, the Lord's Baptism begins His ministry, as the Child we see incarnate in the cave in Bethlehem comes to John the Baptist as a grown man, and commands His herald to baptize Him, and is proclaimed as the Beloved Son of the Father even as the Holy Spirit rests upon Him like a dove. With His baptism, He begins His visible and public work of salvation for us. Second, in His descent into the water and His coming out again, the Lord gives us a sign and token of His Life-giving Death and Resurrection. As He is baptized, the Lord exorcises the waters and blesses them, making this first fruit of the Creation good and holy, our first taste of the New Creation, even as in His Death and Resurrection, He brings death itself under His authority and power, so that those who die in the hope of the Resurrection pass in death from death to life. And third, by making the waters Holy, a first fruit of the New Creation, He gives to us a means with which to bless and sanctify our homes and the other things of this world to His service.

#### How To Use Holy Water

This being the case, then, Holy Water is not a matter to be treated lightly. It is used to bless people, physical objects, vehicles, homes and businesses, physical spaces and even animals by sprinkling. It is also consumed by the Faithful, but only after fasting, as with Holy Communion, and it is therefore usually consumed first thing in the morning, after Morning Prayers. This drinking is reserved for Orthodox Christians, but it may be consumed by the Faithful when they are unable to receive Holy Communion. It is also appropriate to anoint one's self with Holy Water in the sign of a cross when one is sick, or if one is awakened by a bad dream, along with a prayer for the Lord's help. Holy Water is the Sacrament that we can take home with us!

#### Celebrating Theophany

We are all accustomed to scheduling our lives around the Christmas and Easter celebrations, and in both cases the Church provides us with several options for services to attend. We are less used to making the Feast of Theophany a priority, but in this, we are truly missing out. The services for Theophany are some of the most meaningful and beautiful services of the year. I therefore urge every family to consider making these services a priority. If you come for the Divine Liturgy on Saturday, January 6th, and then stay for the Blessing of the Waters, the children will take great joy in the sprinkling of the waters, while the adults may marvel and weep at the prayers and hymns and readings which proclaim the Lord's transformation and healing of the entire Creation. These services (as well as the Friday morning Royal Hours, or the Friday evening Vesperal Liturgy) are simply magnificent. I pray that we will see many of you there!






