#### Liturgical Ministries

*Choir* - the choir practices weekly on Thursday evening. Those interested in joining should speak with the director, Kathy Cooney.

#### Youth & Young Adult Ministries

Catechism School - the Sunday instruction of our young people runs from September through May. We are always in need of teachers, both full time and substitute; if you are interested, please contact the Catechism School directors.

*Greek School* - Greek School classes are held weekly on Monday evenings. If you would like to register your children, or volunteer to help, please contact the Greek School directors.

GOYA - GOYA is for young people from 6th-12th grade. They meet monthly after Catechism School, hold various fun activities, and volunteer all year at parish events. Please contact the GOYA advisors to be added to the contact list.

*HOPE/JOY* - the ministry for children from preschool to 5th grade. It meets roughly monthly for activities, both at the Church and elsewhere.

AGAPE – we are seeking interested mothers of infants to build this ministry

*Oratorical Festival* - held each spring for 7th-12th grade students. Each student prepares and presents a speech about our Orthodox Faith.

Youth Singers- young people are preparing to lead a Holy Week service in '24 Greek Dance Groups - for all ages, they practice perform traditional Greek

Dances at the Festival and other events.

*Maids of Athena/Sons of Pericles* - the youth auxiliaries of the AHEPA family, these groups serve throughout the life of the community.

#### Catechetical Ministries

*Monday Adult Catechism Class* - for inquirers and catechumens, this class meets each Monday to discuss the essentials of the Christian Faith.

Wednesday Bible Study - for all the Faithful, this class discusses selections from the Old & New Testaments and other elements of the Church's tradition.

*Religious Education Initiative* - this is a family guide to religious education in the home; you can find link in the sidebar on page 1.

*Speakers Committee* - this group of parish leaders from all ministries/organizations arranges workshops, talks, and presentations throughout the year.

#### Adult Ministries

AHEPA - men's group that sustains Hellenic heritage, education, civic responsibility, philanthropy, etc. They operate an apartment building, fund scholarships for young people, and actively support parish life in countless ways.

*Daughters of Penelope* - women's group that promotes Hellenism, education, philanthropy, civic responsibility, family and individual excellence, working closely with AHEPA and the parish, funding scholarships, and serving all.

Ladies Fellowship Lunch Group - meets monthly off site for fun & friendship Young-at-Heart - this social group for senior citizens meets for monthly luncheons and other activities at the Church.

Welcoming Committee - helps inquirers and new members to connect to our worship and our community

Young Adult/Young Couples/Young Parents Ministries - we seeking interested young adults, couples, and parents to establish and build these ministries





## 2023 Parish Council Elections

There are five open positions for Parish Council. Each position will serve a three-year term starting January 2024. The list of eligible candidates will be presented at the October 22nd Fall General Assembly meeting.

Elections will be held by secret ballot on **Sunday, November 12th** from 11:30am-1:00pm in the Athenagoras room.



The Parish Council is the administrative body of the parish elected by its stewards for the purpose of working together with the parish Priest in fulfilling the mission and goals of the church. Parish Council members serve as role models for parishioners and must take their ministry seriously. They should lead by example by attending Church and other parish events, and regularly participating in the sacramental life of the church. By doing so, they will have a powerful effect on the overall life of the community. If Parish Council members treat everyone with love and respect, as Christ loves us, then parishioners will do likewise. ## ANNUNCIATION INVESTMENT FUND: 2024 BUDGET REQUESTS
